The ACE program is looking for high school sophomores who have taken at least 6 high school credits at the time of the application submission and who meet **two or more** of the following criteria:

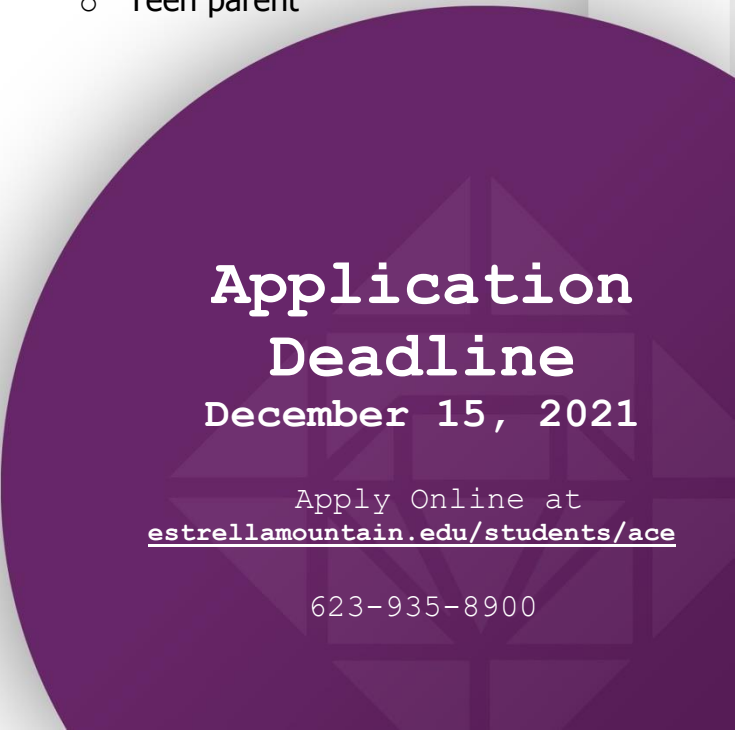
- First generation to attend college
