## Report Descriptions – April 2018

AZCC Transfer student = student transferring into an AZ public university with 12 or more accepted transfer credits from AZ public community colleges

Statewide and UV reports: 12 or more combined from all AZ public CCs

Individual CC: 12 or more from the individual CC

MCCCD: 12 or more from all MCCCD CCs combined

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**New Transfer Reports:** Provides 6 year trend of number of AZCC transfer students into an AZ public university. Breakouts for ethnicity, gender, age, hours transferred, and discipline. Academic years from 2011/2012 through 2016/2017.

**New Transfer by Academic Prep:** Provides 6 year trend of number of AZCC transfer students into an AZ public university by academic preparation. Is prepared about 6 months after New Transfer Report, as community college data has a one year lag. Academic years from 2011/2012 through 2016/2017.

**Baccalaureate Degree Reports:** Provides 6 year trend of number of AZ public university baccalaureate recipients in the academic year that entered the university as an AZCC transfer. Breakouts for ethnicity, gender, age, hours transferred, discipline and academic preparation. Academic years from 2011/2012 through 2016/2017.

**Bacc Degree Recipients w/ AZCC Credits:** Provides 6 year trend of number of AZ public university baccalaureate recipients, with the number who had AZCC credits at the time of graduation and the number who entered the university as an AZCC transfer. Breakout for hours transferred. Academic years from 2010/2011 through 2015/2016.

**Enterprise Metric: Grad Rate:** Provides the number and percentage of fulltime AZCC transfer students that graduated with a baccalaureate degree from the university within 4 years of transfer (through the summer semester of the 4<sup>th</sup> year). Fulltime means enrolled in at least 12 hours in Fall entry semester. Individual reports by fall cohort for Fall 2011 through Fall 2013.

**Reverse Transfer Reports:** A one-time report showing the counts of transfer students that may have university credits to transfer back to the college that might be applied to an associate's degree. Potential reverse transfer students must have transferred at least 15 credits from the CC to the UV, not already have an associate degree, and has earned at least 60 hours of CC and UV credits combined. **Course Progression Reports:** A one-time report using data from the Shared Numbering System, this student-level report shows how a student progresses in a given discipline at ASU, NAU or UA. Select a specific SUN course and the report shows students that enrolled in the course at your community college with the grade received, and enrollment and grades received at the universities in courses of the same discipline. 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**New-to-Higher-Ed Transfer Rate Reports:** Provides the number of students that are new to postsecondary education (NHE) at the community college, and the number and percentage that enrolled at an AZ public university after 4 different time periods, 3 years through 6 years. Breakouts for general (NHE with 12+ earned hours in 1<sup>st</sup> 3 years), transfer intent (general + [transfer intent or transfer reason for attending or enrolled in a core general education course]), and transfer behavior (general + [transfer intent or transfer reason for attending] + completed a core general education course) cohorts. NHE cohorts from 20062007 through 20132014. Example: After 3 Years for 2010-2011 cohort means transfer occurred through Spring 2014.

**Institution Comparison Reports:** Provides comparison of total counts on the New Transfer and Baccalaureate Degree reports with other colleges of the same type (either rural or urban). The other colleges are not identified. Academic years from 20112012 through 20162017.

**New Transfers – Grad Rate Reports:** Provides number and percentage of AZCC transfer cohort in an academic year that received a baccalaureate degree from any of the AZ public universities within 10 different time periods, 1 year through 10 years. Breakouts for academic load (fulltime or parttime) and academic preparation. Transfer cohorts from 20062007 through 20142015. Example: Year 3 for 2012-2013 cohort means degree received through Summer 2015.

**First-Year Performance Reports:** Provides NCCBP Survey data about students who transferred to an Arizona public university. The data includes number of transfers, average cumulative first-year GPA, total first-year credit hours and the average credit hours taken in the first year, and persistence to the next year at the same university. Transfer cohorts from 20112012 through 20162017.

**Junior Year GPA:** This report compares the average junior year GPA of new AZCC transfers to the average junior year GPA of new freshman and non-AZCC transfers. The data includes students who were junior level with positive net hours and non-null term GPA in both fall and spring semesters of the academic year, and only data in fall and spring semesters are used in the GPA calculation. Academic years from 20112012 through 20162017.

**New Freshman with AZCC Credits:** Provides 6 year trend of number of entering New Freshmen to the university who have any AZCC credits. Breakouts for ethnicity, gender, age, and hours transferred. Academic years from 20112012 through 20162017

**Other AZTransfer Reports:** The Key Performance Indicators report is a compilation of statewide indicators identified by the AZTransfer Steering Committee as measures of effectiveness. The ATF Degree Reports report on the number of bachelor's degree recipients by major for each ATF (Articulation Task Force), with the number of AZCC transfers.
