

Additionally, at the end of the Fall 2022 semester, the Nursing Division introduced 43 new nurses into the West Valley workforce and achieved a 100% NCLEX-RN pass rate in the Spring of 2023!





IVAN JACOBO, EXECUTIVE CHEF AND OWNER, ANHELO RESTAURANT, 2024 AZ Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Entrepreneur of the Year. Chef Ivan Jacobo, an EMCC Culinary Arts alumnus, initially dreamed of becoming a mechanic. However, a fascination with Food Network shows during high school shifted his focus towards cooking. Inspired by the artistry of culinary creation and a revealing poll among classmates, he embarked on a culinary journey. Attending culinary school at EMCC, he expanded his skills beyond the classroom and seized every opportunity for additional experience. After various culinary roles, including at a renowned San Francisco restaurant, he returned to Phoenix and ventured into the food truck scene before establishing Anhelo. Recognized by Wine Spectator for its fine dining and vibrant wine program, Anhelo distinguishes itself through charitable endeavors, including donations to LoveIAM for children with heart defects and scholarships for culinary students. Chef Jacobo prioritizes a familial work environment, fostering career advancement for his staff while ensuring worklife balance. Committed to both guest satisfaction and community impact, he dedicates himself to enriching the lives of others, mirroring the support he received on his journey to success. Family remains central to his life, with dedicated time for his wife and daughter, whom he involves in his work, echoing his own upbringing. Driven to give back to those who supported him, Chef Jacobo embodies a commitment to excellence in hospitality and community enrichment, shaping Anhelo's success through a blend of culinary mastery and compassionate leadership. The Anhelo Scholarship Foundation provides scholarships for students in the EMCC culinary program.



DR. NANCY CATALAN

Nancy Catalan, Pharm.D., BSND, attended Estrella Mountain Community College, where she earned her associate degree in 2014. She then went on to Arizona State University to complete her Bachelor's in Nutrition and Dietetics in 2017 and graduated with her Doctor of Pharmacy from Midwestern University, College of Pharmacy-Glendale in 2021. Nancy worked in a retail pharmacy setting for over 10 years as a pharmacy technician. During this time, she learned that there is a special bond that is built when a patient feels comfortable communicating with their pharmacist. Nancy expresses, "This experience helped me set goals to become a bilingual healthcare provider and fill the need for a Spanish-speaking pharmacist. My hope is to help the town of Wickenburg and surrounding communities with any bilingual pharmacy services."

ALEXISS MAILLOUX, an EMCC graduate, is breaking barriers in the male-dominated field of cybersecurity. Now a Senior Cyber Security Analyst working for a global company, she investigates and responds to potential cyber threats for high-profile clients.

Originally intending to pursue a career in nursing, Alexiss shifted gears after realizing she was too squeamish for medicine and discovered her passion for programming. She immersed herself in EMCC's cybersecurity program. Despite the gender imbalance, she thrived with the support of her professors, especially Tom Polliard, who helped her land her first internship and job. She credits her early success to Professor Polliard's passion and encouragement.

With a combination of hard work, passion, and support from EMCC, Alexiss is proving that success in cybersecurity knows no gender.

FACULTY PROFILES

DR. JAROD RAITHEL is a residential biology faculty member in the Life Sciences Division. His teaching extends beyond the classroom and looks to engage students and the community. Dr. Raithel founded the Animal Ambassadors Community Outreach Program in 2018. The program is a student-led initiative that epitomizes the essence of community college education. Dr. Raithel takes currently enrolled students and helps them develop leadership skills and a love for ecology and service. The team maintains a collection of over 20 species of native and exotic reptiles, amphibians, and arthropods that are utilized in educational outreach at local schools, public recreation centers, and other nonprofits free of charge. In 2022-23 alone, the ambassadors hosted 432 groups of visitors and close to 900 guests during our open lab hours.

MEHA TRIVEDI serves as a faculty member and Program Director at Estrella Mountain Community College (EMCC), where she applied her Masters degree in Computer Science and 17 years of industry experience to establish the EMCC Computer Science program. Her 12-plusyear academic tenure also includes supporting institutional initiatives as Division Chair, developing the EMCC Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning program, and teaching, mentoring, and guiding students in their technology journey. Meha has been instrumental in positioning EMCC at the forefront of the IT and Cybersecurity Landscape with the first-ever Al and Machine Learning associate degree and certification program in the country.



"I BELONG" CAMPAIGN. The 'I Belong' Campaign won the District's Diversity Advisory Council Award of Excellence for 2023. Faculty members Lisa Stevens, Briana Procunier, Dr. Anastasia Amabisca, and Susan Malmo won the district-wide accolade for launching the caring campaign. 

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

THE MS DATA CENTER ACADEMY, located on the ground floor of Estrella Hall on EMCC's main campus, is the result of a collaboration between EMCC, Glendale Community College (GCC,) and Microsoft. The Data Center Academy is one of only 11 programs worldwide. The project serves students from both colleges and aims to help them get into high-demand, high-paying jobs in IT by delivering cutting-edge training in collaborative learning environments that offer hands-on experiences. The Partnership was nominated in the category of West Valley Quality of Life Enhancement in Education Award for taking a holistic approach to enhance the quality of life of the students it serves, their families, and their communities and was a runner-up in WestMARC's 29th Annual Best of the West Awards Event.

CITY OF SURPRISE: INVESTING IN EDUCATION

The City of Surprise is making a significant investment in education by allocating \$30,000 from its annual budget to provide scholarships for EMCC students. Students in any of the applied technology programs can apply for funding through the Maricopa Community Colleges Scholarship Manager Portal. This partnership began in 2023 and offers scholarships to students in eight high-demand applied technology areas of study, including: Automated Industrial Technology I and II, Electrical, Mechanical, and Robotic Systems Technology, the Semiconductor Technician Quickstart Program, and Back End and Front End Software Development Coding Bootcamps. This initiative reflects a significant effort to enhance the workforce skills of EMCC students, address industry demands, and create opportunities for community members to thrive in technologydriven careers.

AVONDALE EDGE

EMCC is committed to addressing the needs of our community and students, especially as we navigate the post-pandemic landscape. In a significant step toward this goal, we secured a \$430,000 grant from the City of Avondale to help revitalize the service and healthcare industries. This funding will provide scholarships for Avondale students enrolled in our culinary and nursing programs, offering them the opportunity to pursue careers in these vital fields.

Our partnership with the City of Avondale extends beyond education. Together, we've established a One-Stop Basic Needs center that integrates social services between the city and our college, providing comprehensive support to our students. This initiative is designed as a model that can be replicated with other municipalities within the EMCC service area, demonstrating our commitment to expanding support systems across the region.

Additionally, the EMCC Student Food Pantry is available to assist students experiencing food insecurity, and the Lion's Boutique offers clothing for those in need. Through these efforts, we aim to create winwin opportunities that support our students and strengthen our community.

EMCC'S MICROCHIP MANUFACTURING PROGRAM

The Semiconductor Technician Quick Start job training program is a collaborative effort with business partner Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company (TSMC). It is a 3-credit course delivered over two weeks that trains students with the knowledge they need to enter the semiconductor industry successfully. The course feeds directly into the Automated Industrial Technology AAS degree program. This collaboration has been lauded by Arizona legislators Kate Gallego and Mark Kelly as an example of efforts connecting Arizonans to high-paying manufacturing jobs.

ARIZONA HISPANIC-SERVING INSTITUTION (HSI) CONSORTIUM

The U.S. Department of Education designates colleges and universities as HSIs when at least 25% of their undergraduate students are Hispanic. Dr. Rey Rivera (EMCC) and Dr. Marla Franco (UA) founded the AZ HSI Consortium in 2021 to unite the 20 Arizona HSIs into a community of practice to improve Latino Student Success in Arizona. Drs. Franco and Rivera want to create the institutional conditions needed to ensure that Latinx students, employees, and those from underrepresented backgrounds feel culturally affirmed and can thrive as they learn and work at our HSIs. The consortium engages in professional development, supports the exchange of evidence-based and culturally relevant practices, facilitates the successful transfer of students, and collaborates to seek funding opportunities and partnerships. One of the consortium's signature events is the AZ HSI Summit, held annually at a different AZ HSI. EMCC hosted the first summit in 2022.





Estrella Mountain Community College (EMCC) is committed to meeting our community's evolving educational and professional needs. Recognizing the importance of comprehensive student support, we provide flexible scheduling, online learning options, and a robust support system, ensuring students have the resources needed to succeed. By continuously seeking partnerships to meet student's needs, we empower our students to achieve their educational and career aspirations.

Looking ahead, we remain focused on key areas to enhance student outcomes and community impact:
