



MUSIC COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

MUSIC HISTORY AND LITERATURE COURSES:

MHL 140: Survey of Music History

Study of composers, compositions, styles, and periods in music history. [General Education Designation: (HU) Humanities and Fine Arts].

MHL 143: Music in World Cultures

Non-European musical traditions including the study of music in rituals, musical instruments and the impact of cultures on musical styles. [General Education Designations: (G) Global Awareness; (HU) Humanities and Fine Arts].

MHL 145: American Jazz and Popular Music

The study of cultural and social contributions to the evolution of American jazz and popular music from the mid-1800's to present. [General Education Designations: (C) Cultural Diversity; (HU) Humanities and Fine Arts].

MHL 153: Rock Music and Culture

History of Rock music and how cultural, social, political, and economic conditions have shaped its evolution. [General Education Designations: (H)Historical Awareness; (HU) Humanities and Fine Arts].

MHL 204: Hip-Hop Music and Culture

A history of Hip-Hop`s musical and artistic elements and how cultural, social, political, and economic conditions have shaped its evolution. [General Education Designations: (L) Literacy and Critical Inquiry; (C) Cultural Diversity; (HU) Humanities and Fine Arts]. (Prerequisite: Grade of C or better in ENG101 or ENG107 or with permission of instructor).

MUSIC THEORY AND COMPOSITION COURSES:

MTC 191: Electronic Music I

An introduction to creating music with computers, utilizing the Musical Instrument Digital Interface (MIDI) protocol, synthesizers, digital audio software/hardware, and MIDI controllers.

MTC 192: Electronic Music II

Continued study of creating music with computers, utilizing the Musical Instrument Digital Interface (MIDI) configurations, audio editing, and music software/hardware at the intermediate level. Emphasis on more complex configurations and their applications in compositions. (*Prerequisite: Grade of C or better in MTC191*).

MTC 193: Computer-Based Sound Synthesis

Principles of sound synthesis using computer-based methods. Synthesis methods include subtractive, additive, frequency modulation, sample and synthesis, and hybrid. Emphasis on synthesis techniques for use in electronic music. (Prerequisite: Grade of C or better in MTC191 or permission of instructor).

MUSIC PERFORMANCE COURSES:

MUP 127: Class Guitar I

Emphasis on note-reading and folk-style harmonic accompaniment. Includes finger-style playing. Stresses development of efficient practice techniques and proper sitting and hand positions.

MUP 130: Introduction to Class Piano

Basic introduction to piano techniques and fundamentals of music including hand position, sight-reading of both melodic and harmonic materials, and the introduction of scale patterns. Designed for those with little or no piano experience.
